cring the life cycle cost prepare Quality plan and provide a durable structure with a fast method of construction.

(C) THE ROLE OF THE CONTRACTOR:

- (a) The role of the contractor is envisaged, as a facilitator to the owner in finalising the bid document including arriving at the realistic estimated cost of the project. They should study the contract documents well in advance, give their positive responses during the pre-bid conferences for arriving at practical and transparent contract documents.
- (b) The contractor should price his offer considering the use of required equipments and should mobilise them well in time and keep the equipments in running and good performing condition while the work is in progress. It is the Contractor who is overall responsible for Quality of Work.

III OTHER ISSUES:

- (a) Today in the changing scenario of liberalised economy the contractor is being considered as a part of the team comprising of owner consultant and contractor. It warrants a change in mindset of all the three.
- (b) Bridge engineering needs specialised knowledge and expertise with continuous updating of the same through human resource development.
- (c) Importance should be given to develop good project managers for better performance in addition to working out systems for better project management. The project team should be permitted to continue from the inception to the end, to the extent possible. It is the man behind the project who contributes substantially for the early and proper completion of a project.

(d) Safety should be given due importance at the planning, construction as well as serviceability stage.

DRDA Works in Assam

BHATTACHARJEE: Will the Minister of RURAL AREAS AND EMPLOYMENT be pleased to state:

(a) what are the reasons for total stoppage of work of DRDA for the last two months in Assam when Government have promised to ensure the development of rural areas and employment to the rural folk; and (b) what steps Government contemplate to take to restart these works?

THE MINISTER OF RURAL AREAS AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI YERRAN NAIDU K.) (a) and (b) The Government of Assam have denied that the work of DRDAs in Assam is totally stopped for the last two mon,ths. It has been reported by them that a ban was imposed on the transaction of funds by DRDAs with a view to complete audit of DRDAs/Development Blocks. The process of varification and inspection field DRDAs/Development Blocks is going on. However, schemes relating to IRDP, Flood Control/Land Protection, Construction of School buildings under JRY/ EAS and Construction of IAY houses have been exempted from the preview of the ban and implementation of the above schemes is going on. The State Government have assured that all other works will be completed within the time limit as per schematic guidelines.

As far as release of funds by the Government of India for the year 1996-97 is concerned, the position is given in the Statement.
