THE MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI S. R. BOMMAI): (a) to (c) The Framework for National Curriculum for Elementary and Secondary Education developed by the National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT) in 1988 states that the medium of instruction should be the mother tongue. In the case of learners whose mother tongue is also the language of the region, the medium of instruction at elementary stage should be the regional language. In the case of those where mother tongue is different from the regional language, the mother tongue may be used as medium during the first two years of primary education and the regional language should be used subsequently.

NCERT's guidelines have been circulated to the state Governments.

#### **Programme for development of sheep wool**

\*331. SHRI RAJENDRA PRASAD MODY: Will the Minister of ANIMAL HUSBANDARY AND DAIRYING be pleased to state:

HUSBANDARY AND DAIRYING (SHRI RAGHUVANSH PRASAD SINGH): (a) The Government have initiated several steps for the development of sheep/wool, which include:

i. Setting up of Central Sheep Breeding Farm for production and supply of acclimatised exotic and crossbred rams to the State Governments for bringing genetic improvement.

ii. Assisting the State Governments instrengthening of sheep farms for production and supply of superior stock in field and in undertaking market inteivention activities.

iii. Setting up of a high level Central Committee to advise the Government on all matters relating to development of sheep, goats and rabbits.

iv. The Central Wool Development Board of the Ministry of Textiles has been supporting various projects for the utilisation of wool which include Integrated Sheep/Wool Development Programme, Wool Scouring Plants, Wool Testing Centres and Industrial Service Centres, Carpet Weaving Training Centre, Training Scheme for manufacture of woollen products, Weaving and Designing Training Centre etc.

(b) The country's share in the export of woollen fabrics and woollen garments is 0.6 per cent and 0.78 per cent respectively, of the world trade.
