Big Powres' Effort to keep India out from U.N. Council

3116. DR. GOPALRAO VITHALRAO PATIL: Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that some big powres are making concerted efforts to keep India out of the restructured Security Council;
- (b) if so, the special efforts made to thwart the design of big powers and secure a seat for India with the power of veto in the new restructured Security Council;
- (c) the efforts being made to enlist the support of NAM Countries in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI I.K. GUJRAL). (a) No, Sir.

(b) and (c) There is no shared view among the permanent members of the Security

Council on the issue of an expanded Security Council needing to include developing countries. Idnia is taking an active part in the discussions on this subject in the Open Ended active part in the discussions on this subject in the Open Ended Working Group of the United Nations General Assembly on the Question of Equitable Representation on and the Increase in the Membership of the Security Council. India has made it clear that any expansion of the Security Council which does not include developing countries in permanent as well as in non-permanent members category would not be acceptable. India has offered to serve as a Permanent Member of the Security Council. India's efforts at the Xlth NAM Summit in Cartagena also led to the adoption of a Declaration calling for a substantial increase in the proportion of NAM Member States in the UN Security Council.
