The Government of Tamil Nadu has also brought out a Legislation called Tamil Nadu Acquaculture (Regulation) Act, 1995 with effect from 3-5-95, which inter-alia provides for ecologically sustainable acquaculture practices. The Supreme Court has presently prohibited conversion of agricultural land for acquaculture of prawns.

Railway Network and Infrastructure Development in U.P.

MAULANA OBAIDULLAH KHAN AZMI: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

- (a) the areas in Uttar Pradesh where there is potential for developing railway network;
- (b) the plans and schemes in this regard; and
- (c) the steps taken to intensify railway network and to augment railway infrastructure development in Uttar Pradesh?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI SATPAL MAHARAJ): (a) and (b) Based on representations from MPs and State Govts. regarding the lines required for the development of rail network in Uttar Pradesh. the following surveys for new lines have been taken up:-

- 1. Panipat to Meerut (100 Kms.) (Partly in U.P.)
 - 2. Rishikesh Dehradun (30 Kms.);
- 3. Haridwar Ramnagar Kotdwara (125 Kms.).
- 4. Dehradun to Saharanpur 4(70 Kms.).
- Kiccha Sitarganj-Nanak Mata-Khatema (55 Kms.)
 - 6. Tanakpur-Purnagiri (15 Kms.).
- 7. Muzaffarnagar to haridwar Roorkee (95 Kms.)
- 8. Rishikesh to Karanparyag (185 Kms.)
- 9. Chandigarh—Dehradun Pointa Saheb (220 Kms.) (Partly in U.P.)

Further consideration of the above projects would be possible once the survey reports become available.
