Cancellation of flights from Rajahmundry and Vijayawada

(a) the reasons for cancellation of flights from Rajahmundry and Vijayawada;

(b) whether the services will be restored; and

(c) by when the work for upgradation of Rajahmundry and Vijayawada airports are to be taken up?

THE MINISTER OF CIVIL AVIATION (SHRI C.M. IBRAHIM): (a) Vayudoot operations to Rajahmundry and Vijayawada were discontinued due to commercial and operational constraints.

(b) Indian Airlines has at present no plans to restore operations to Rajahmundry and Vijayawada. Private operations to Rajahmundry and Vijayawada. Private operators, however, are encouraged to add more stations in their network including Vijayawada and Rajahmundry.

(c) Airports Authority of India has plans to upgrade Vijayawada Airport and the work is expected to be awarded during the last quarter of 1996-97.
