THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF PLANNING AND PROGRAMME IMPLEMENTATION (SHRI YOGINDER K. ALAGH): The projections for ground level credit disbursement for agriculture and allied activities (both production and investment credit) including non-farm sector for the year 1996-97 for All India and Punjab are Rs. 35596.27 crores and Rs. 2551.25 crores, respectively. These projections of the banks also include Cooperative Banks and Regional Rural Banks.

Lok Sabha Elections in J&K

73. SHRI ASHOK MITRA: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government's attention has been drawn to the statement of the Jammu and Kashmir National Conference that the recent Lok Sabha elections in the State have been neither free nor fair;

(b) whether Government have also taken cognisance of the Chief Election Commissioner's comment that he could neither vouchsafe for nor against the allegation of exercise of force or threat of force by army personnel so as to cajole voters in the valley to cast their ballots; and

(c) the measures proposed to be taken for the proposed forthcoming polls for the State Assembly in Jammu and Kashmir so as to obviate the scope for lodging such allegations?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PERSONEL, PUBLIC GRIEVANCES (AND PENSIONS (SHRI S.R. BALASUBRAMONIYAN): (a) to (c) The Government is aware of press report on the points raised in parts (a) and (b) of the question. Government has consistently pointed out that allegations with regard to elections in J&K are baseless, and that the elections were free

and fair, despite a sustained campaign of threats and intimidation against all participants in the electoral process by the terrorist and secessionist elements. The Government will take all possible steps to ensure that elections to the State Assembly can also be totally free and fair and peaceful.

Violation of Human Rights by Police

(a) whether the Chairman, National Human Rights Commission, while addressing Golden Jubilee Celebrations of the Lions Club International had stated that the biggest culprit in violation of the Human Rights is the Police as reported in the Dainik Jagaran of 7th May, 1996;

(b) if so, what is Government's reaction thereto;

(c) what action Government propose to take to check violation of Human Rights by the Police;

(d) the number and details of cases of such violations that have come to light in Delhi and other States and Union Territories during the last three years; and

(e) the action taken by Government in those cases?
