Central Grant Under Rural Sanitation Programme in Karnataka

*569. SHRI GUNDAPPA KORWAR: Will the Minister of RURAL AREAS AND EMPLOYMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the Karnataka Government has launched a massive campaign for construction of household latrines in rural areas and have incurred as expenditure of Rs. 16.82 crores;

(b) whether the matching grant under the Centrally sponsored Rural Sanitation Programme has been released; if so, the details thereof; and

(c) if not, the reasons therefor and by when it is proposed to be released?

THE MINISTER OF RURAL AREAS AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI YERRAN NAIK): (a) Yes, Sir. The State Government of Karnataka is reported to have released Rs. 16.92 crore during the year 1995-96 for own duction of household latrines out of the State's own resources.

(b) the details of Central assistance provided by the Government of India to

the State Government of Karnataka under centrally sponsored Rural Sanitation Programme (CRSP) during VIII Five Year Plan were as under:

(c) Outlays of Central assistance under the Centrally Sponsored Rural Sanitation Programme (CRSP) are allocated to various States in accordance with fixed criteria, taking into account incidence of poverty, rural population and difficult areas. The States have to necessarily provide matching contribution under their Minimum Needs Programme (MNP) against Central releases of funds under the CRSP. The States are, however, free to provide more than the required matching contribution under their MNP to widen the coverage as well as to increase the pace of implementation of the rural sanitation programme.
