cannot be fitted with catalytic converters for using unleaded petrol; and

(b) the measures proposed to be taken by Government to minimise pollution levels of the existing licenced old vehicles'?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF ENVIRONMENT AND FORESTS (CAPTAIN JAIN NARAYAN PRASAD NISHAD): (a) The total number of registered 4-wheeler petrol vehicles in the four major metropolitan cities of Delhi, Mumbai, Calcutta and Madras as on 1.4.1995 is given below:

The Government has, from 1.4.1995, permitted the registration of only those new four-wheeler petrol vehicles in these four metropolitan cities which have been fitted with catalytic converters and designed to use unleaded petrol. Presently, it is not considered practically feasible or economically viable to retrofit older vehicles with catlytic converters.

- (b) The measures being taken and proposed for control of pollution from on-road vehicles include the following:
 - State Transport Authoriteis enforce the emission standards stipulated for onroad vehicles.
 - (ii) Lead level is planned to be reduced to a maximum of 0.15 grammes per litre in petrol to be supplied throughout the country by December, 1996.
 - (iii) Sulphur content in diesel has been reduced to 0.5% in the diesel supplied

in the four metropolitan cities of Delhi, Mumbai, Calcutta and Madras from 1.4.1996. It is planned to reduce this* further to 0.25% in the diesel supplied throughout the country with effect from 1.4.1999.

- (iv) Intensive awareness campaigns have been launched by Transport Departments of cities including Delhi, to educate people about the health effects, measures for maintenance and the statutory punitive provisions related to vehicular pollution.
- (v) Steps have been initiated to introduce compressed natural gas in petrol driven vehicles in some of the cities.

Study on Freight Operations Information System

* 150. SHRIBRATIN SENGUPTA: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have got conducted a study by the ITT on the development work of Freight Operations Information System (FOIS) with a budget of over Rs. 4079 crores;

(b) if so, whether IIT has since submitted its report with the findings; and

(c) if so, what are the findings and Government's response thereto?

THE MINISTER OF RAILWAYS (SHRI RAM VILAS PASWAN): (a) Yes, Sir. However, the sanctioned cost of the Freight Operations Information System (FOIS) project for implementation on the Northern Railway is Rs. 267.2 crore, and the cost of implementing the project for the Indian Railways as a whole was estimated to be Rs. 1098 crore.
