

(e) if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF SURFACE TRANSPORT (SHRI T.G. VENKATRAMAN): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) and (c) This Ministry is primarily concerned with development of National Highways only and all other roads fall within the purview of the respective State Govts. As regards National Highways, the VIIIth Five year Plan provides for two laning in 1350 Kms and four laning in about 650 Kms. However, its implementation will depend upon the availability of resources.

(d) and (e) Mostly four laning of National Highways is being undertaken under various externally aided programmes, in the last several years. About 1000 Kms of four laning has already been taken up under these programmes.

Compulsory Registration of Marriages

THE MINISTER OF WATER RESOURCES (SHRI JANESHWAR MISHRA): (a) Eight Multipurpose Hydrel Projects have been approved by the Central Government.

(b) Construction is going on in all projects except one i.e. Lakhwar Vyasi Project.

(c) The following projects have been under dispute or delayed due to some other reasons.
