Employment to Rural Youths in Haryana

2413. SHRI LACHHMAN SINGH: Will the Minister of RURAL AREAS AND EMPLOYMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of unemployed rural youths in Haryana provided employment so far under various schemes and programmes during the last three years, year-wise and district-wise;
- (b) the target fixed and achivement made for the rural employment during this period; and
- (c) the effective measures being taken by Government to provide more employment to the unemployed youths in the State?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RURAL AREAS AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI CHANDRA-DEO PRASAD VERMA): (a) and (b) Integrated Rural Development Programme (IRDP), Jawahar Rozgar Yoiana **Employment** (JRY) and Assurance Scheme (EAS) are special employment programmes implemented by the centre in Haryana to provide self employment and wage employment for the unemployment and underemployed persons including eligible rural unemployed youths. District-wise targets and achievement are monitored. However, the details of the target fixed and achievement made for self employment wage-employment in Haryana under these programmes are as under:-

- (c) The following are some of the important measures being taken by the Government to provide more employment in an effective manner:—
- (i) Greater involvement of Panchayati Raj Institutions in the implementation of Integrated Rural Development Programme (IRDP).
- (ii) Abolition of the cut off line (fixed at Rs. 8,500/-) to enable all families Living below the poverty line to be assisted under IRDP.
- (iii) Switch over from front-end subsidy to back-end subsidy i.e. depositing of the subsidy amount in the name of beneficiary in the bank with the

- stipulation that the money so deposited will be adjusted towards the last few instalments of repayment.
- (iv) Enhanced subsidy for trained, educated rural youth belonging to families below poverty line.
- (v) Increase in ceiling for programme infrastructure from 10% to 25% in North-Easters States including Sikkim and 20% in other parts of the country.

(c) and (d): IOC has signed an MOU Kuwait Petroleum Corporation (KPC) recently to set up a 6 MMTPA refinery in Orissa as Joint Venture Project. Government have accorded stage-1 clearance of the project for preparation of detailed feasibility report. **Besides** this. **Bharat** Pctroleum Corporation Limited (BPCL) have plans to set up new oil depots at Paradeep, Balasore Rourkela and Rayagada. Oil (OIL) Indid Limited has exploratory work in Mahanadi basin and drilled 4 wells in the onshore and 11 wells in offshore but no commercial discovery of hydrocarbons has been made. OIL plans to start the second phase of drilling in the North East Coast offshore in 1996-97 drilling in by an exploratory well.

Power Projects Awaiting Clearance from CEA

2415. SHRI V. NARAYANASAMY: be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that around 30 power projects are awaiting clearance from the Central Electricity Authority;
- (b) if so, the details thereof and since when these have been awaiting clearance;
- (c) the expected power generating capacity;
- (d) whether there are proposed to be set up in the public sector or private sector; and
- (c) the steps proposed to be taken to expedite work on these projects?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF POWER (DR. S. VENUGOPALACHARI): (a) to (e) The details of 7 Private Sector porjects aggregating to 2746 MW (Thermal 1930 MW and Hydro 816 MW) and 13 projects in State and Central Sector aggregating to 7172 MW (Thermal 6372 MW and Hydro 800 MW) for which Detailed Project Reports have been received and which are currently under various stages of examination in the Central Electricity Authority (CEA) as given in the Statement (see below). The technoeconomic clearance of these projects by CEA are pending, for want of various inputs from the project authorities, which cover statutory and other clearances from the state and central agencies, additional information on project costs and financial and other linkages, packages, fuel environment clearances etc. from the promoters of the projects. These project proposals would be considered for accord of techno-economic clearance by the CEA as soon as the pending inputs clearances are tied up by the projects proponents.
