Reduction of Tariff Charge for Local and STD Calls

5426. SHRI YERRA NARAYANA SWAMY: Will the Minister of COMMUNICATIONS be pleased to state:

(a) whether the tariff charged for both the local and STD calls would be reduced;

(b) whether it is as fact that new telecom technology reduces' the use of manpower; and

(c) the details as to how Government determine the cost of telecom service?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF COMMUNICATIONS (SHRI SUKH RAM): (a) No such proposal is under consideration.

(b) Yes, Sir. However there will be no reduction in manpower in Department of Telecommunications, on account of large scale expansions proposed;

' (c) The costs of telecom service are "determined on the basis of expenses on maintenance and operations, and interest and depreciation on the amount f capital invested.

New Distribution System for Telephone Directories

(a) whether Government have deviled a new system for delivery of telephone directories;

(b) if so, what system is proposed to be adopted in Andhra Pradesh; and

(c) whether directory information would be updated every year?

THE MINISTER. OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF COMMUNICATIONS (SHRI SUKH RAM): (a) No, Sir.

(b) The existing system of distribution of the directories by the Department would continue for Andhra Pradesh Circle.

(c) The directory information is being updated regularly.
