

Durgapur Steel Plant

1833. SHRI JIBON ROY: Will the Minister of STEEL be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the Durgapur Steel Plant is likely to suffer a loss of about Rs. 30 crores in the current financial year due to cut down order of 'Wheel and axles by the Railways; and

(b) if so, the steps taken by his ministry to resume the cut down order?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF STEEL (SHRI SONTOSH MOHAN DEV): (a) Durgapur Steel Plant is likely to suffer a loss of about Rs. 26 crores during the current financial year due to cut down order of Wheel & Axles by Railways.

(b) Ministry of Steel is making continuous efforts to persuade the Ministry of Railways to step up their procurement of Wheel & Axles from the Wheel & Axles Plant, Durgapur having regard to the fact that the plant has been modernised at a total cost of Rs. 142.77 crores mainly with the objective of catering to the requirements of Railways.

Allotment of Type VI and VII Quarters

(a) the percentage of type VII and type VI houses that are given under the discretionary quota of the Hon'ble Minister in Delhi;

(b) whether any norms and guidelines are being followed for allotment under this quota;

(c) if so, what are those norms and guidelines;

(d) the number of type VII and type VI houses that have been allotted under the discretionary quota during the last year; and

(e) the names of allottees who were beneficiaries of such allotment and the norms which entitled them?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF URBAN DEVELOPMENT (SHRI P. K. THUNGON): (a) to (c) As per the provisions contained in SR 317-B-25 of the Allotment of Government Residences (General Pool in Delhi), Rules 1963, Government may relax all or any of the provisions of Allotment Rules in case of any officer or residence of class of officers or type of residences. Under this provision the competent authority sanctions ad-hoc allotment at his/her discretion taking into account the service conditions and family circumstances of the officer concerned. Such allotments are generally made in one below the entitled types.
