Water Transport Corporation Ltd., Calcutta (a public sector undertaking under Ministry of Surface Transport) is operating all their cargo vessels in National 'Waterways No. 1 (the Ganga-Bhagirathi-Hooghly river system), and 2 (the Brahmaputra).

The Government of India is primarily concerned with the development and maintenance of National Waterway*, through Inland Waterways Authority of India (IWAI). The IWAI has schema to develop these waterways for full utilisatiwr in phases, depending on cargo offering.

(d) to (e) The National Waterway* can be used by any private operater Besides, ²he IWAI has introduced incentive schemes to promote inland water transportation by private operators.

Declaration si New National Highways in Gujrat

2621. SHRI KANAKSINH MOHANSINH MANGROLA: WiS! the Minister of SURFACE TRANSPORT be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have received any proposals for declaring new national highways in Gujarat; if so, which roads are proposed to be declared as natioal highways;

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF SURFACE TRANSPORT (SHRI JAGDISH TYTLER): (a) to (c) The Government of Gujarat has forwarded ten proposals aggregating to a length of 2510 km. for declaring as new Naional Highways in the 8th Five Year Plan. However, owing to meagre allocation of funds for National Highways during the Eighth Plan, it is difficult to decalre new National Highways in any State including Gujarat at this point of time.
