Talks between India and Bangladesh In Inland Waterways

@3024-A. SHRI H. HANUMAN-THAPPA: Will the Minister of SURFACE TRANSPORT be pleased to state:

(a) what are the details of talks held between India and Bangladesh regarding inland waterways; and

(b) what are the follow-up actions taken by both sides?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF SURFACE TRANSPORT (SHRI JAGDISH TYTLER): (a) and (b) In accordance with Protocol signed between the Governments of India and Bangladesh on 14.9.1993, the Government of Bangladesh will maintain two specific stretches of waterways to be primarily used by the Indian Transit vessels. For this purpose, it has also been agreed by India to pay a sum of TK 137 lakhs in 1993-94 which has already been paid and TK 150 lakhs is to be paid to Bangladesh in 1994-95. The agreement also provide for sharing of inter-country traffic on 50 : 50 basis by the two countries. This

agreement is effective from 4.10.1993 and shall remain in force upto 3.10.1995.

RE. DEMAND FOR EXTENSION OF CURRENT SESSION TO DISCUSS J.P.C. REPORT ON SECURITY SCAM

THE DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: I haVe to inform the Members....

SHRI VIZOL (Nagaland): Madam.

THE DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: Just a minute. I have to make an announcement.

SHRI VIZOL: Madam, I am on a point of order.

THE DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: I will allow you. Will you please sit down for a minute?

I have to inform the Members that we had a Business Advisory Committee meeting today at 10.30. We took the opinion of the Members. There was a desire that we should adjourn the House on 23rd. And I took the view of the leaders of the various political parties and other groups, and they greed that the House should adjourn on 23rd and finish the pending business on the 23rd itself.

SHRI P. UPENDRA (Andhra Pradesh): How can it be?

THE DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: This is what the leaders in the Business Advisory Committee decided. You should ask the leaders.

DR. MURLI MANOHAR JOSHI (Uttar Pradesh): We would like that this JPC report should be discussed. And why not extend the session?

THE DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: I was going to tell you that there was also a demand that the Report of the JPC regarding the scam which was laid on the Table of the House should be discussed. So, it was agreed that we will discuss it tomorrow, and. we can sit till late in the evening as long as we do not finish our business of discussion.

(Interruptions)

SHRI P. UPENDRA: The House has been called up to 24th. The House has to approve it.

THE DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: This is a decision of the Business Advisory Committee. *(Interruptions)* Mr. Upendra, you were a Minister for Parliamentary Affairs. You know that it is the Business Advisory Committee which gives the advice. And there are Members... *(Interruptions)*

DR. MURLI MANOHAR JOSHI: The best course would be to extend the session rather than to adjourn and discuss it in a lackadaisical manner. The best thing would be that we extend the session.

THE DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: That also was taken into account.

DR. MURLI MANOHAR JOSHI: We can sit on Monday and Tuesday...

THE DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: It was also discussed. And in the present circumstances, it was not possible. So, I would say that now that matter is closed.

SHRI M.A. BABY (Kerala): May I make a submission, Madam?

THE DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: Let the Papers be laid on the Table.

SHRI M.A. BABY: Madam, the National Cultural Policy was also listed. Now the scam has become the national culture. But my submission is that we should discuss both.

THE DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: If you like to discuss, we will sit late.

(Interruptions)

DR. MURLI MANOHAR JOSHI: The House may be adjourned for three days and...

THE DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: That suggestion came. The Members of the various parties, leaders and representatives of the various political parties were there. But it was not accepted. So, let us go ahead...

DR. MURLI MANOHAR JOSHI: We

cannot do justice to this Report. This is a historic Report and it should be discussed in all its aspects. And I would plead that the session be extended or a special session be called in the first week of January.

SHRI DIENSHBHAI TRIVEDI: (Gujarat): Madam, if the session cannot be extended, we can have a special session in the first week of January.

THE DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: We had never in the past...*(Interruptions)* Please let me put one thing very clear. *(Interruptions)* Just a minute, please. We are having new precedents and new procedures started. Never before the decision of the Business Advisory Committee was discussed.

SHRI P. UPENDRA: Madam, I am on a point of order. The session has been called up to 24th. The House has to approve it. The BAC cannot take a decision...

THE DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: Mr. Upendra, please.

(Interruptions)

AN HON. MEMBER: What about JPC Report?

THE DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: We are discussing it tomorrow.

DR. MURLI MANOHAR JOSHI: We find that something new has happened in the country, and a new thing has to be started.

SHRI P. UPENDRA: Madam, I am on a point of order.

THE DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: Let the papers be laid on the Table.

SHRI KAMAL MORARKA (Rajasthan): Madam, I want a clarification. This is a JPC report. This is a report of Parliament. Tomorrow if we start discussing it, will the Government make a statement on action taken against the people who have been indicated in the report? Are they only for a discussion on the report? There is nothing to discuss

in the report. That is our report. There is nothing to discuss about it. We want to know from the Government what action the Government is taking against the Ministers who have been indicted in the report...*(Interruptions.)* I don't think we can discuss the report as such.

DR. MURLI MANOHAR JOSHI: We would demand action also on the report.

SHRI MENTAY PADMANABHAM (Andhra Pradesh): Will the Government make its position clear? *(Interruptions.)*

THE DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: I am not going to allow a discussion on the report today itself.

SHRI MENTAY PADMANABHAM: Madam, try to understand our point.

THE DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: I understand.

SHRI MENTAY PADMANABHAM: Let the Government make its position clear.... *(Interruptions.)*

THE DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: One person at a time.

SHRI KAMAL MORARKA: Madam, my point of order is that the reports of Parliamentary Committees are never discussed in the House. The Public Accounts Committee and the Estimates Committee day in and day out are giving reports which are tabled in the Parliament. *..(Interruptions.)*

SHRI V. NARAYANASAMY (Pondicherry): This is a Joint Committee. Others are Standing Committee. Let him understand the difference.

SHRI KAMAL MORARKA: Mr. Narayanasamy, I can never match your ignorance. Just wait for a minute. The Public Accounts Committee is also a Joint Committee; the Committee on Public Undertakings is also Joint Committee. This was a special Committee on one subject. I do not think it is proper for Parliament to start a discussion on the report because nobody can criticise the report. It is a unanimous report of the Joint Committee. What can

we discuss about it? We only want to know from the Government as to what action they are taking on the report, if any.

SHRI V. NARAYANASMY: we discussed the report on Bofors. *(Interruptions.)*

SHRI VITHALRAO MADHAVRAO JADHAV (Maharashtra): Madam,....

THE DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: Are you replying to the point of order, Mr. Jadhav?

SHRI KAMAL MORARKA: Madam, my submission on a point of Parliamentary procedure is, we will be sitting a wrong precedent if we start criticising our own report. We cannot have a discussion on the report. What is required is, the Government must announce the removal of the Ministers who have been indicted in the report and make its position clear. Unless the Government is willing to do that, I do not think we can have any discussion on the report.

THE DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: Regarding the point of order raised by the hon. Member, the special Committee was constituted for it and that is the reason why whenever Members wanted to raise any matter relating to the scam, we always said and the Government said that till the Committee's report comes, we cannot take up that issue because the matter is- before the Committee. It was the desire of the Members. Now if the Members do not want to discuss, it is again their desire.

SHRI KAMAL MORARKA: Members cannot make the rules. This is the position.

THE DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: It was a demand.
