1588. SHRI SUSHILKUMAR SAMBHAJIRAO SHINDE : Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state :

(a) whether the Indian men's tennis squad won for India the first ever Asiad tennis 'gold' in the 12th Asian Games held in Hiroshima;

(b) if so, what steps have been taken by Government to award the tennis team suitably at the National level, for this achievement; and

(c) what was the final medals* tally of Indian participants in the 12th Asian Games and what position did India have amongst the Asian Countries at the Hiroshima Asian Games?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (DEPARTMENT OF YOUTH AFFAIRS AND SPORTS) (SHRI MUKUL WASNIK) : (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) Government will honour these Tennis players alongwith other medal winners of 12th Asian Games and XV Commonwealth Games on 17th December, 1994 in a function to be held at Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi under the Scheme of Special Awards to winners of medals in international sports events.

(c) India won 22 medals (4 Gold, 3 Silver and 15 Bronze) in the Games and was placed at 8th position. The details of the medals won by Indian teams is given below :—
