Keeping out Historians and Archaeologists from Third World Archaeological Congress

(b) Details of World Archaeological Congress-!.

The World Archaeological Congress-? was held in New Delhi from 4-11 December, 1994. The Congress was inaugurated on 5th December, 1994 by Hon ble Minister for Human Resource Development, Government of India.

To coincide with the World Archaeological Congress-3 in New Delhi foui special exhibitions viz., (1) India and the Indus Civilization, (2) Conservation and Preservation of monuments in India and abroad, (3) Indian Megaliths in Asian perspective, and (4) Rock Art of India were mounted by the National Museum in collaboration with the Archaeological Survey of India, Deccan College Post-Graduate Research Institute, Pune, Indira Gandhi Rashtriya Manav Sangrahalaya, Bhopal and Department of Archaeology and Museums. Government of Haryana. The National Museum also brought out three special booklets on the above exhibitions.

In the Congress 886 delegates from India and abroad participated. There were 493 foreign delegates and 393 Indian delegates. Over 700 papers under 14 major themes, 63 sub-themes and 7 symposia were presented by the Archaeologists, Anthropologists, Linguists, Scientists and Specialists from related disciplines.

Concept of Time, Archaeology as an Indicator of Trade and Commerce, Language, Anthropology and Archaeology. Ethnoarcheology, State, City and Society, Neogene, Changes in Agrarian Systems, Cultural Property, Conservation and Public Awareness, Relationship between Archaeological Theory and Practice. Changing Perspectives in Historical Archaeology, Frontiers of Landscape Archaeology and Archaeological Manifestations "" of Religious Traditions and Institutions were the major academic themes in the Congress.

Topics of Symposia included Indus Civilization, Archaeological Source Material and Reconstruction of History, Rock Art of Asia and the Pacifies, New Archaeological Discoveries, Recent Advances in Archaeological Field and Laboratory Techniques, Maritime Archaeology and Archaeology on film and video. The Congress provided an opportunity to the delegates to interact, discuss and share valuable information on interesting archaeological discoveries made all the world over, view and interpret various types of primary and secondary archaeological data.

On 8th December, 1994, the delegates were taken to Agra and Fatehpur Sikri **for** showing them round the World heri-

tage monuments, *i.t.* Taj Mahal **Agra** Fort and monuments at Fatehpur Sikri.

With a view to provide a glimpse of Indian classical and folk dances, cultural programmes were arranged on 5th, 6th and 10th December, 1994. Seven special lectures giving an overview of Indian Archaeology were delivered by eminent Indian scholars.

In the Plenary Session, three resolutions viz., inclusion of Bhimbetka Rock shelters in World Heritage List, all Archaeological Departments and Institutions throughout the world be headed by Professional Archaeologists and reaf firmation of the faith in the International Charter for the Conservation and Restora tion of Monuments and Sites, called the Charter of Venice (Venice, 1964) and Recommendation on International Principles applicable to Archaeological Excavations (adopted by the General Conference at its 9th Session, UNESCO. New Delhi) were passed unanimously by voice vote.

Valedictory Function of the Congress was arranged on 11th December, 1994 at Vigyan Rhavan, New Delhi. The Valedictory address was given by Dy. Minister for Education and Culture, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India.

To organise the World Archaeological Congress-3 in New Delhi, an Academic Committee comprising 25 eminent Archaeologists and Historians, a Consultative Committee comprising Members of Academic Committee, individual scholars and various Institutional representatives and Directors of State Departments of Archaeology were constituted by the WAC. Besides the above, an Executive Committee, an Exhibition Committee, n. Reception Committee and Academic Programme and Publication Committee were also set-up by the WAC to look after various aspects of the organisation of the Congress.
