Uniform Syllabus in Schools

2826. SHRI RAJNI RANJAN SAHU: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government are taking any measures to ensure that history books or books showing the part played by eminent leaders in freedom struggle for High Schools are not changed to suit the ideology of a party which comes to power in a State even though for short period;
- (b) whether Government propose to formulate uniform syllabus for the country so that students do not learn different things in different parts of the country;
- (c) if so, the details of the proposal; and
 - (d) if not, the reasons therefor?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (DEPARTMENT DEVELOPMENT (DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND DEPARTMENT OF CULTURE) (KUMARI SELJA): (a) to (c) The National Policy on Education envisages a National system of education based on a National Curricular Framework containing a common core cutting across different subject areas. These components aim at promoting values such as history freedom struggle, India's cultural heritage, egalitarianism, democracy and secularism, etc. Based on the Frame-work guidelines and the revised textbooks of the NCERT, the State Governments are expected to adopt or adapt, the same for revision of school curricula, syllabi and textbooks in their respective school systems in a phased manner.

The Ministry of Human Resource Development has set up a National Steering Committee in June 1991 to review the school textbooks from the standpoint of National integration. The reports of the Committee and their recommendations are sent to the concerned State Government for implementation.

An overwhelming majority of the schools in the country are under the control of State Governments and they enjoy full autonomy in all school education matters, including prescription of syllabi and textbooks, within their respective jurisdiction.

EDUCATION AND DEPARTMENT OF CULTURE) (KUMARI SELJA): (a) to (e) The All India Management Association organised a set of innovative state-of-the-art management seminars in the first week of December, 1994 in 13 cities all over the country with the objectives to disseminate knowledge on issues in management on the topics, namely, managing computer security, business process rengineering etc. The Govt. has not received the suggestions made at these Seminars. The question of taking any action thereon does not arise.

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (DEPTT. OF EDUCA-TION AND DEPTT. OF CULTURE) (KUMARI SELJA): (a) to (e) The Question deals with two distinct issues namely the post of Director General, Archaeological Survey of India and holding of the World Archaeological Congress. So far as the post of Director General, Archaeological Survey of India is concerned this post has been lying vacant after the retirement of the last incumbent on 31st March. 1993. No officer of the Archaeological Survey of India was found eligible for promotion as per the then Requitment Rules. The post was advertised and also circulated to all the State Governments and Central Departments. A Search Committee was also constituted and applications received were forwarded to UPSC. Since the pay scale of the post of Director General. Archaeological Survey of India had been revised after the 4th Pay Commission and since the Recruitment Rules were of earlier years, the UPSC decided that the Recruitment Rules will have to be amended and that pending

amendment the mode of recruitment may be settled with the Commission. In view of this decision of the Commission no Recruitment Rules deem to exist. The Government in the interregnum directed the Additional Director General (Admn.) to look after the current charge of the duties of Director General, Archaeological Survey of India. The approval of the Commission for the new mode of recruitment has been obtained under which the qual:fications and years of experience have revised to cover been number of instituions and with higher qualifications. persons with higher qualifications. The post has also now been advertised as per the new mode of recruitment as approved by the Union Public Service Commission. As soon as the recommendation of UPSC received for the appointment of an eligible candidate, the post will be filled with the approval of Appointments Committee of the Cabinet.

To ensure proper coordination and control, the Government have now entrusted the work of Director General, Archaeological Survey of India to Secretary, Culture

The World Archaeological Congress-2 was held for the first time in India. The Government of India have given the organisers of the Congress adequate financial support. Many officers of the Archaeological Survey of India were members of the various Committees of the Congress and were also presented theme papers during the Congress.
