

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF URBAN DEVELOPMENT AND THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF WATER RESOURCES (SHRI P. K. THUNGON): (a) and (b) An agreement was signed between Government of India and the World Bank on 10th May, 1985 for the implementation of Sardar Sarovar Project. The resettlement and rehabilitation component of the project was, however, not covered under the World Bank financing. Owing to criticism and agitations by environmental activities, both in India and abroad, the Government of India disengaged the project from the World Bank financing with effect from 29.3.1993. It has been decided to compensate the loss due to disengagement of this project from World Bank assistance by providing additional central assistance.

Sharing of Ganga Waters between India and Bangladesh

2246. SHRI G. G. SWELL: Will the Minister of WATER RESOURCES be pleased to state:

(a) whether Bangladesh has made known her intention of going to the International Court over the question of sharing the Ganga waters;

(b) whether he has tried to persuade Bangladesh not to resort to such action; and

(c) if so, the results thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF URBAN DEVELOPMENT AND THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF WATER RESOURCES (SHRI P. K. THUNGON): (a) India has not been informed by Bangladesh about their intention of going to the International Court of Justice over the question of sharing of Ganga waters. Suggestions for making such a move

have been made by some political parties and individuals.

(b) and (c) Do not arise.

Completion of Irrigation Schemes in Maharashtra

(a) whether it is a fact that Government of Maharashtra have sent some proposals to the Central Government regarding completion of the State's irrigation schemes;

(b) if so, what are the details thereof; and

(c) what decision has been taken by the Central Government on those proposals?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF URBAN DEVELOPMENT AND THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF WATER RESOURCES (SHRI P. K. THUNGON): (a) and (b) A proposal requesting permission for project specific bonds during the year 1992-93 for a namount of Rs. 100 crores to raise additional resources through public borrowings for expeditious irrigation projects in Maharashtra during construction of Major and Metra had been received from Government of Maharashtra.

(c) The Government of India has not agreed to the proposal as the present scheme of Public Sector Bonds is restricted to only those undertakings which are wholly or partly owned by the Central Government.

Completion of Indira Gandhi Canal Project in Rajasthan

(a) the reasons for the inordinate delay in the completion of the multipurpose Indira Gandhi Canal Project in Rajasthan;

(b) whether it is also a fact that Government have not been sanctioning the additional funds required for the project;

(c) if so, the details of the amount of funds and the period within which they would be made available; and

(d) the steps Government propose to take to complete the project to alleviate the sufferings of the people of Rajasthan?

THUNGON): (a) Delay in the completion of the Indira Gandhi Canal Project of Rajasthan has been due to various reasons like escalation of cost, change in scope of project with the decision to line the water courses, slow pace of colonisation due to lack of infrastructural works necessitating inclusion of roads, markets, drinking water supply and afforestation as part of project activities.

(b) to (d) Liberal central assistance has been extended to the project from time to time for Canal and Area Development Works as under:
