**PRODUCTION OF COTTON DURING  
1993-94**

3306. SHRI AHMED MOHAMMED  
BHAI PATEL : Will the Minister of  
AGRICULTURE be pleased to state :

(a) whether cotton production during 1993-94 season which commenced from September has increased in comparison to the last year;

(b) the total production during 1992-93 and to what extent it is more in comparison to the previous year ;

(c) what are the States where production of cotton has improved ;

(d) whether sufficient measures were taken by Government to ensure that cotton growers do not suffer due to increase of cotton production; and

(e) if so, what action is proposed to be taken to meet the situation ?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN

(SHRI ARVIND NETAM) : (a)  
No, Sir.

(b) The production of cotton during 1992-93 was 115.83 lakh bales i.e. higher by 19.2 per cent over 97.14 lakh bales of the previous year i.e. 1991-92.

(c) The major cotton growing States where its production increased during 1992-93 are Gujarat, Haryana, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Rajasthan and Tamil Nadu.

(d) and (e) Government provides price & market support to ensure that the cotton growers do not suffer due to increase in cotton production. The Government fixes the Minimum Support Prices (MSP) of cotton every year. The cotton Corporation of India (CCI) which is the nodal agency designated for undertaking price support operations, makes purchases of cotton, whenever the cotton price tend to decline. Release of quota for export from time to time and the market intervention at commercial rates, are also resorted to, to ensure that the prices of cotton do not fall below the MSP level due to increase of cotton production.
