Change in base year for WPI and CPI

3595. SHRI 1QBAL SINGH Will the Minister of LABOUR be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of times the base year for the wholesale price index and consumer price index for industrial workers and agricultural labour, separately, were revised since 1960;
- (b) what are the reasons for changing the base year;
- (c) whether it is a fact that the Consumer Price Index for Agricultural, Labour has not been revised since 1960; and
 - (d) if so, reasons therefor?

MINISTER OFTHE STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR (SHRI P. A. SANGMA) The based year for the wholesale price index was revised thrice since 1960, viz., in July 1968 with Base year 1961-62=100, in January 1977 with 1970-71=100 and in July 1989 with base year 1981-82-100 As regards Consumer Price Index for Industrial Workers, the base year has been updated once in October 1988 to base 1982=100. No revision has been done so far in case of CPI for Agricultural Labour.

(b) Base year is periodically updated to account for changes in the consumption pattern, commodity classification and coverge, relative wheight of various items in the consumption basket and to account for the structural changes taking place in the economy.

(c) Yes, Sir.

(d) It was decided to update the serious to base 1986-87=100. The task of working out weighting diagram

and commodity specification, markets, base prices etc. takes some time due to which the series with updated base could not be released so far. The work with regard to revision of base year of Index for agricultural labour is at an advanced stage.
