Will the Minister of URBAN DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether DDA had in 1992 invited representations from parties for out of court settlements of disputes;
- (b) if so, the number of representations received for out of court settlements;
- (c) what is the mechanism set up by DDA for the consideration of such representations and what is the number of cases that have been decided; and
- (d) the number of cases in which no action has been taken and by when all the cases are likely to be decided?

THE MINISTER OF URBAN DEVELOPMENT (SHRIMATI SHEILA KAUL): (a) Yes, Sir. Public notice in newspapers inviting representations was issued in 1991.

- (b) 217 persons had submitted representations till 15-7-1993 for out-of-court settlement of cases.
- (c) DDA has set up a committee to recommend out-of-court settlement of court cases. The recommendations of the Committee are put to Vice-Chairman or Lieutenant Governor by the concerned administrative department for appropriate decision. The Committee has already made final recommendations in respect of 34 cases.
- (d) Recommendations are yet to be made in respect of 183 cases. Taking into consideration the complex nature of cases, it is not possible

to fix any time limit for final disposal of such cases.
