

Abolition Licences for Agricultural Industries

541. SHRI P UPENDRA: Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Kissan Coordination Committee has demanded abolition of all licencing requirements for agricultural industries and all restrictions, including quotas and canalisations, on agricultural exports; and

(b) if so, what steps Government are taking to meet the demands of the farmers?

(b) The Government have taken a number of steps for abolition of licencing requirements and rationalisation of export procedures. The recent amendments to the trade policy (1992—97) announced on 31-3-1993 have further liberalised trade policies pertaining to agricultural exports .

KRISHNA KUMAR): (a) and (b) Sir, Agricultural Scientists are closely working with farmers by organising held demonstrations, training, field days and adaptive trials on various aspects of agriculture including water management. Scientific information thus generated from the fields (land) are passed on to the research laboratories (labs) of State Agricultural Universities and ICAR Institutes as a feed back (reverse communication). Progressive farmers are also invited to the universities/institutes to interact with Scientists through lectures and seminars. This also provide feed-back to the researchers.
