Development of forests in Karnataka district in Tamil Nadu

However, Central Government extends financial assistance on the basis of specific project proposals received from State Governments. So far, no proposal has been received from the Government of Tamil Nadu to develop tourist facilities for attracting tourists to these forests in Kamarajar District.
