Reservation facility under Northern Railway

- 1925. SYED SIBTEY RAZI: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:
- (a) whether return journey reservation facility is available at certain places under Northern Railway in Delhi;
- (b) if so, the names of these places with names of places of country connected with this facility for return journey reservation;
- (c) whether Government propose to provide return journey reservation facility at reservation-cum-booking offices functioning at Parliament House and Rail Bhawan as a step to further enlarge the existing facilities; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI K. C. LENKA): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) Return Journey facility is available at the Computerised Reservation Offices of IRCA New Delhi / Delhi Main / Sarojini Nagar / Nizamuddin / Kirti Nagar/Delhi Shahdara / Karkardooma / Parliament House '/ Railway Board / Baroda House/ International Tourist Bureau / New Delhi station from Lucknow, Bhopal, Jammu Tawi, Amritsar, Jodhpur Jn., Gorakhpur, Bikaner, Ambala, Kanpur, Allahabad, Varanasi, Jaipur and Agra Cantt. Further, return journey facility in respect of trains falling within the ambit of Bombay, Calcutta and Madras Passenger Reservation, Systems viz., ex. Bombay Central, Bombay VT, Ahmedabad, Pune, Dhanbad, Howrah, Asansol, Guwahati, Patna, Cuttack, baneswar, Visakhapatnam, Madras, Manglore, Banglore, Trivandrum Central, Tiruchirapalli. Madurai, Coimbatore Ernakulam is available on the nominated terminals at IRCA, Delhi Main and Sarojini Nagar Reservation Offices in Delhi area. Besides, return journey quotas have been provided in some trains which originate from some other stations which have not been provided with computerised reservation facility.

(c) and (d) As stated in answer to part (b) of the question, return journey reservations facility from various stations mentioned therein is already available at Parliament House and Rail Bhawan and further extension of the facility is not envisaged at present.

Direct rail link between South and Batala in Puniab

- (a) whether it is a fact that Batala, an industrial town of Punjab which previously had direct rail link with the South does not have a direct link now;
