(b) if so, the reaction of Government thereto;

(c) whether Government have analysed the reasons for such a low performance; and

(d) if so, the steps taken in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI ARJUN SINGH): (a) to (d) Joint Entrance Examination conducted for admission to IITs is an all India competitive examination. Since 1990, the students are allowed to write this examination in English or in any one of the 14 Indian languages which has been their medium of instruction in 10+2 examination in Physics Chemistry and Mathematics. The factual data and statistical analysis of JEE, 1990 made by the organising Institute indicates a comparatively low pass percentage of the students writing the examination in vernacular. It has been the experience that factors like advance preparation by the students, formal coaching, family background etc., have a bearing on the success of students in the JEE. The specific reasons could be analysed if a similar trend continues in JEE, 1993 also

**Report of expert committee on flood management in North Eastern Region**

\*258 SHRI TARA CHARAN MAJUMDAR: Will the Minister of WATER RESOURCES be pleased to state:

(a) the action taken by Government on the report submitted by the Expert Committee on Flood Management in the North Eastern Region;

(b) whether it is a fact that the committee submitted its report in December, 1988; and

(c) what were the terms of reference of the committee and what were its principal recommendations?

THE MINISTER OF WATER RESOURCES AND THE MINISTER OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS (SHRI VIDYACHARAN SHUKLA):

(a) and (b) Yes, Sir. The Committee submitted its report in December, 1988. The report of the Committee was sent to all concerned State and Central Departments. Subsequently it was also reviewed by an Empowered Committee and follow up action to be taken were sent to them in January, 1991.

(c) The terms of reference were to review all flood management activities and suggest recommendations for prioritisation of schemes, their financing and maintenance. The main recommendations covering both short term and long-term measures lay stress on non-structural measures such as flood forecasting and flood proofing, early completion of ongoing schemes, their evaluation and proper maintenance of flood management works.
