Plan lor Children, indicating the details of the plan and the extent to which the same has been implemented so far?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT OF WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT (SHRIMATI BAS-AVA RAJESHWARI): The National Plan of Action covers the decade upto 2000 A.D. The major goals for survival, protection and development of children, as envisaged in the National Plan of Action on Children are as follows:—

- (i i) Reduction of infant mortality rate to less than 60 per thousand live births and reduction of child mortality rate to less than 10 by the year 2000.
- (ii) Reduction of maternal morta- \* lity by half during the period 1990-2000.
- (iii) Reduction in severe and moderate malnutrition among under five children by half, by 2000 A.D.
- (iv) Universal access to safe drinking water and improved access to sanitary means of excreta dis posal.
- (v) Universal enrolment, retention, minimum level of learning reduction of disparities and univeosa- » lisation of effective access of schooling.
- ;vi) Achievement of adult literacy rate of 80 per cent in the age group 15—35 with emphasis on female literacy; and
- (vii) Improved prtotection of children in especially difficult circumstances.

In some sectors intermediate goals have also been set.

The National Plan of Action for children has been finalized in consulta tion with the concerned Ministries in the Government of India. The con cerned Ministries in the Government of India and the State Governments Territories and Union Administra tions are taking necessary steps for its implementation with a view attain the goals set therein. The Annual Plans have been finalized in various sectors keeping in view these goals.

A high level Committee monitors the progress of implementation of National Plan of Action.
