

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND DEPARTMENT OF CULTURE (KUMARI SELJA): (a) The prescribed qualifications for appointing part-time teachers for teaching Nutrition and Food Preparation courses are as follows:

(i) M.Sc. (Home Science)

or

B.Sc. (Home Science)

with a diploma from an Institute of Food Management

or

Diploma in catering & Hotel Management.

The rates of remuneration of part-time experts/teachers presently in-force are Rs. 50/- per hour for Theory classes and Rs. 25/- per hour for practical classes subject to the maximum limit of Rs. 800/- per month.

(b) to (e) Sanction for disbursement of salary to teachers for the current year has been issued to the respective schools by Delhi Administration. The Administration tries to make payment of remuneration to part time teachers regularly.

Activities of sports Authority of India

(a) what are the details of various Schemes and activities of the Sports Authority of India; and

(b) whether Government propose to review the same in order to encourage sports in the country?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (DEPARTMENT OF YOUTH AFFAIRS AND SPORTS) WITH ADDITIONAL CHARGE OF THE MINISTRY OF

STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS (SHRI MUKUL WASNIK): (a) The Sports Authority of India (SAI) is presently implementing the following main schemes for the development of sports:—

(i) National Sports Talent Contest (NSTC) Scheme

(ii) Sports Project Development Area (SPDA) Scheme

(iii) Sports Hostel Scheme

(iv) Army Boys Sports Companies Scheme

(v) Special Area Games (SAG) Scheme

(vi) National Coaching Scheme
Details of these schemes are given in the Statement (See below).

Other Schemes implemented by SAI are:

(i) National Physical Fitness Scheme

(ii) Sports Science Research Fellowship Scheme

(iii) Sports Talent Search Scholarship Scheme

(iv) Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Rural Sports Tournament

(v) National Sports Festival for Women

(vi) North East Regional Sports Festival

(vii) Central Pool of Technical Sports equipment

(viii) Promotion of sports in large size Residential Schools and Public Sector Undertaking Townships

(ix) National Sports Academies

In addition SAI is involved in creation of sports facilities at its regional centres as well as running the stadia under its charge in Delhi and assists in development of excellence in sportspersons identified for participation in major international events.

(b) These schemes are occasionally reviewed and last review was undertaken during the year 1991-92 by the Rajenaran Committee. There is no proposal to review the schemes again.

Statement

Activities of sports authority of India

(1) National Sports Talent Contest Scheme

Under the scheme children between the age group of 8 to 12 years are scouted and nurtured and provided free boarding, lodging, sports training, Education, Sports Kit, Medical and Insurance. Presently about 1100 children are under training under the Scheme.

(2) Sports Project Development Area Centre Scheme

Under the Scheme, the SPDA Centre is established to cover 80 to 100 development blocks catering to a maximum of 4 Olympic disciplines. So far 31 SPDA Centres have been established covering 688 students.

(3) Sports Hostel Scheme

The Sports Hotel Scheme was conceived to impart Coaching, Training and nutritious diet to sportspersons who have attained advanced level of sports proficiency. The students between age of 16 to 21 are covered under the Scheme. So far 17 Sports Hostels have been established

(4) Army Boys Sports Companies Scheme

In collaboration with the Director General Military Training the scheme of NSTC has been extended for

raising 13 Army Boys Sports Companies at various Regimental Centres in the country. The children from the age group of 10 to 14 are covered under the Scheme. Presently 487 children in various disciplines have been admitted under the scheme.

(5) Special Area Games (SAG) Scheme

Under the Scheme, sports talent from tribal, coastal, hilly and other far flung areas of the country is scouted and trained in modern competitive sports. The Scheme also envisages tapping of talent from indigenous games and martial arts and also from regions which have come genetic, geographical or physical attributes advantageous for excellence in particular sport, Presently about 448,9 trainees in 11 SAG Centres are undergoing training in various disciplines.

(6) National Coaching Scheme

This scheme is a major source for meeting the requirements of coaches of various user agencies like Regional Coaching Centres, District Coaching Centres, University Field Stations and National Sports Federations Associations for conducting the Coaching Camps. The total strength of coaches under the scheme till January, 1993 is 1710.

Investment in Sports Promotion and Infrastructure by Private Sector
