Indecent presentation of women through advertisements

- (b) whether it is also a fact that the Indecent Representation of Women (Prohibition) Act, 1986 has failed to check this trend;

THE MINISTER OE STATE TN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (DEPARTMENT OF WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT) (SMT. BASAVARAJESWARH: (a) Yes, Sir. Government has viewed with concern certaint instances of derogatory depiction of women for commercial purposes in advertisements from time to time.

- (b) and (c) Tndecent Representation (Prohibition) Act, 1986 prohibits obscene representation of women'in a manner which is derogatory or denigrating to women or which is likely to corrupt public morality. The enforcemen aspect of the Act is with the State Govern. merits/Union Territories. Government ha, launghed efforts to create awareness about this law and other laws relating to women through widespread legal literacy, sensitization and awareness generation programmes.

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT(DEPTT. OF EDUCATION AN D DEPTT. OF CULTURE) (KM. SELAJ): (a) and (b) A Conference of Chief Ministers' was held on 15th February, 1994. The meeting discussed the reports of the National Development Council (NDC) Committee on Literacy and the Central Adivisory Board of Education (CABE) Committee on Decentralised Management of Education, and proposals related to Education for All.

The Conference decided that Education For All (EFA) should be given the highest priority and support in terms of decentralised management, increased resources and monitoring mechanisms should be provided.

The National Policy on Education (NPE) 1986 already lays considerable stress onvocationalisation of education with the objective of enhancing individual .employability. There is tress also on work experience organised as an ntegral part of the learning process.
