- (c) what steps arc being taken to see that telegrams reach early; and
- (d) what steps will be taken to modernise the telegraph facilities?

- (b) No such cost benefitlti'me benefit analysis has been undertaken.
- (c) and (d) The Department has imdertaken programme to modernize the telegraph services by way of introducing Store & Forward Message Switching Systems which eliminate renual transitiing of the messages and improve the quality of service as well as introdction of new modern terminal devices like E'ectronic Teleprinter machines, PC based Formatted Terminals, Electronic Key boards etc. This programme has already been implemented to certain extent and is likely to be completed during the 8th Five Year Plan Period. With the modernisation of the telegraph services the quality of the telegraph services will improve to a very great extent.
