THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI K. C. I.ENKA): (a) and (b) Yes, Sir. Rail ways are changing aver to colour light and automatic signalling, track circuiting, route-relay and panel interlocking sys tems on a need based programme to coincide with replacements and other system upgradation plans.

- (c) No, Sir.
- (d) At present provision of electrical interloking at 95 stations, automatic signalling for 56.06 Kms. and automatic block clearance at 118 stations are in progress on various zones.
- (e) In 1993-94, rupees seventy crores have been earmarked for signalling works.

Railway Terminal betweetn Guwahati and Tinsukhia

2496. SHRI VIZO'L: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that the Railway terminal between Guwahati and Tinsukhia was provided about a hundred years ago;

- (e) Gauge conversion of Chapramukh-Haibargaon and Lumding-Dibrugarh with linked branch lines is in prograss. Gauge conversion of Rangdya-Markongselek with branches to Bhalukpong/Tinsukia are included in the Action Plan and would also be taken up in the coming years.

Direct link of Chandigarh with Metropolitan Cities

LENKA): (a) and (b) Chandigarh is al-eady connected by direct trains with New Delhi and Howrah, However, provision of direct trains between Chandigarh and Bombay/Madras is presently not easible due to operational constraints and ack of resources.
