

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI K. C. LENKA): (a) and (b) Yes, Sir. Railways are changing over to colour light and automatic signalling, track circuiting, route relay and panel interlocking systems on a need based programme to coincide with replacements and other system upgradation plans.

(c) No, Sir.

(d) At present provision of electrical interlocking at 95 stations, automatic signalling for 56.06 Kms. and automatic block clearance at 118 stations are in progress on various zones.

(e) In 1993-94, rupees seventy crores have been earmarked for signalling works.

Railway Terminal between Guwahati and Tinsukhia

(a) whether it is a fact that the Railway terminal between Guwahati and Tinsukhia was provided about a hundred years ago;

(d) whether Government propose to improvement with regard to passenger amenities has since been made in North-Eastern region except conversion of Railway section between Guwahati to Lumding from metre gauge to broad gauge;

(c) whether this conversion work has not yet been completed even after a lapse of more than two years;

(d) whether Government propose to undertake conversion of other metre gauge sections of North-Eastern Region in to broad gauge connected upto Tinsukhia; and

(e) if so, what are the details thereof and if not, what are the reasons therefor?

(c) The work of conversion of Guwahati-Lumding has since been completed.

(d) Yes, Sir.

(e) Gauge conversion of Chapramukh-Haibargaon and Lumding-Dibrugarh with linked branch lines is in progress. Gauge conversion of Rangiya-Markongselek with branches to Bhalukpong/Tinsukia are included in the Action Plan and would also be taken up in the coming years.

Direct link of Chandigarh with Metropolitan Cities

(a) whether it is a fact that Chandigarh is the only Capital city which is not directly linked with any of the metropolitan cities of the country such as Bombay, Madras or Calcutta; and

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI K. C. LENKA): (a) and (b) Chandigarh is already connected by direct trains with New Delhi and Howrah. However, provision of direct trains between Chandigarh and Bombay/Madras is presently not feasible due to operational constraints and lack of resources.
