#### Loss of Mandays

7410. SHRI BHAGABAN MA-MAJHI:  
Will the Minister of LABOUR be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have made any review on the loss of man-days;

(b) if so the position during 1992-93 and so far in 1994;

(c) the various steps taken to establish better Industrial relations

so that the loss of mandays comes down; and

(d) the details thereof?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE  
MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY  
WELFARE (SHRI PABAN SINGH  
GHATOWAR):

(a) to (d) The Labour Bureau collects information on loss of mandays due to strikes and lockouts. An analysis on the loss of mandays is published in the Annual Report of the Ministry of Labour. The following table shows the number of mandays lost due to

strikes and lockouts during the last the last five years:

The Industrial relations situation in the country has shown improvement as reflected in the reduction of mandays lost due to strikes and lockouts since 1989. However, during 1992 there was increase in this number which was primarily due to strikes and lockouts in the Jute textile industry. The States of West Bengal, Maharashtra, Andhra Pradesh and Tamil Nadu accounted for a comparatively large number of strikes and lockouts, Cotton textiles, jute, engineering and coal mining industries were amongst the main industries involved in strikes and lockouts and accounted for a large proportion of mandays lost.

Wages and allowances indiscipline and violence and personnel factors were amongst the principal causes of industrial unrest.

The Government have been maintaining a close and continuous watch on the industrial relations situation

in the country. The Industrial Relations Machinery, both at the Centre and in the States are taking steps to resolve disputes and reduce work stoppages through mediation, conciliation, arbitration and adjudication.

#### Accident Prone Mines Identified in Bihar

(a) the number of accident prone mines that have so far been identified by Government in Bihar with details thereof;

(b) the number of fatalities and number of persons sustaining serious injuries in such accident prone mines during the last three years, with details of each year; and

(c) what safety measures Government propose to take for the workers of accident prone mines of the state ?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI PABAN SINGH GHATOWAR) :

(a) and (b) Based on the analysis of accident data for the last 5 years (i.e. 1989-93), 10 coal mines in the State of Bihar have so far been identified as accident prone mines. The names of these mines and the numbers of fatalities and serious injuries are as given below :
