

Separate Sub-cadre for Homoeopathic Physicians

(a) whether it is a fact that Government have brought the physicians of Indian System of Medicines and Homoeopathy under the same sub-cadre of Central Health Scheme;

(b) if so, how this cadre is going to be operated when the proposed Directorate is only restricted to ISM and not Homoeopathy;

(c) whether Government have any proposal to set up a separate Directorate for Homoeopathy as the present proposal is for setting up of Directorate for ISM only; and

(d) if not, the details of the proposed arrangement to streamline the separate sub-cadre of Homoeopathic physicians?

Rise in the tropical infections in the country

(a) whether Government's attention has been drawn to a news-item published in the Hindustan Times dated 2nd March, 1994 captioned "Tropical infections on the rise" indicating abnormal increases in inflammatory manifestations of lymphatic filariasis and Sexually Transmitted Diseases in children;

(b) whether it is also a fact that KALA AZAR or leishmaniasis, has re-emerged in the country and predictions against infectious disease control are proving inaccurate;

(c) if so, the details thereof and what preventive measures programmes Government have chalked out during the eighth plan period to check the menace?
