Group 'D' employees of Sangathan can also compete with outsiders for 90% posts meant for direct recruitment. The Group 'D' employees are given age relaxation as per rules.

Rise in Illiterates in the Country

- 3413. SHRIMATI KAMLA SINHA: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that India today produces the largest number of illiterates in the world;
- (b) whether it is also a fact the though the literacy rate has improved since independence, the absolute number of illiterates has increased from 294 million in 1951 to 482 million in 1991; and
- (c) if so, what steps Government have taken or propose to take to ensure implementation of Article 45 of the Constitution which makes primary compulsory for every child.

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (DEPARTMENT EDUCATION AND DEPARTMENT OF CULTURE): (KUMARI SELJA): (a) and (b) The literacy rate in the country has increased from 18.33% in 1951 to 52.21% in 1991. As per the 1961 census, the number of illiterates in the age group 5 and above was 267.32 million and the number of literates was 105.52 million. As per the 1991 census the number of illiterates and literates in the relevent age group (revised to 7 and above) have both gone upto 323.88 million and 359 28 million respectively. The number of literates has gone up by 253.76 million while the number of illiterates has gone up by 61.56 million in this period. Though there are no official statistics regarding the number of illiterates in various countries, according to some estimates, our number of illiterates continues to be the largest in the world.

(c) The National Policy on Education as revised in 1992 resolves that elementary education of satisfactory quality is to be provided to all children unto 14 years of age before the turn of the century. Towards this end, a disagregated approach will be adopted through district planning. In addition, the following are the main strategies:-
