Will the Minister of FOOD be pleased to refer to answer to Unstarred Question 2133 given in the Rajya Sabha on 17th December, 1993 and state:

(a) what is the installed capacity of sugar mills which were set up from 1990 to 1993 together with production;

(b) the projected demand of sugar for each year from 1994 to 1998;

(c) the average indigenous cost of production of sugar per tonne and landed cost of imported sugar; and

(d) the quantity to be imported in 1994 to meet the current demand of sugar?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF FOOD (SHRI KALP NATH RAI): (a) The details of the instal-led capacity of the sugar mills which were set up from 1989-90 .to 1992-93 sugar seasons (October-September) alongwith their Year-wise production for the above period are given in Statement (See below).

(b) The demand for sugar for the years 1993-94 to 1997-98 projected by the Committee constituted to formulate develop-ment programme for the sugar industry for the earlier 8th Five Year plan is as follows :---

(c) The cost of production of sugar varies from factory to factory and from State to State depending on the technology State to State depending on the technology used, the managerial efficiency, the price paid for sugarcane, recovery factors, etc. Similarly, the landed cost of imported sugar would also depend on various factors such as the contracted FOB price, freight, insurance, etc.

(d) Import of sugar has been placed under Open General Licence (OGL) and the quantity to be imported would depend on the demand and supply position in the market.

(a) what is the expenditure incurred on education during 1993-94 by all the States including the Centre and what percentage it forms of GDP;

(b) the break up of expenditure incurred on higher, secondary and primary educa-tion separately on all India basis and also the average expenditure per student of these three sectors of education; and

(c) the number of students in higher, secondary and primary education in India and the number of teachers in these three sectors and the drop-out rate at the level of 4th, 7th, 10th and 12th standard, respectively ?

THE MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHR] ARJUN SINGH): (a) to (c) The total budgeted expenditure on education by Education Departments of all States and the Centre was Rs. 23911.92 crore for 1993-94 (Budget Estimates). The provision for 1992-93 was Rs. 21369.89 crore (Revised Estimates) which formed 3.5 per cent of GNP. The final figures for expenditure on education and GNP tor 1993-94 are yet to be compiled.

The sectoral break-up of total expenditure, the average expenditure per student, enrolment of student and strength of teachers for 1992-93 (latest available) is as follows :
