(a) whether Government's attention has been drawn to a report published in the Indian Express of 10th April, 1994 under the caption "Maximum HIV cases in India"!

(b) whether it is a fact that as stated in the above report India has more HIV infection cases than any other country in the world;

(c) whether it is a fact that if transmission of HIV continues at the same pace, by 2000 AD there will be five million infected people in Delhi and the number of AIDS cases would exceed one million in the country;

(d) if the answers to parts (b) and (c) above be in the affirmative, what are the facts in this regard;

(e) what is the number of HIV cases in the country Statewise as on 21st March, 1994;

(f) what steps Government have taken or propose to take to check and prevent the HIV infection; and

(g) what are the details of the AIDS Awareness (Control) programmes Government have so far launched?

THE MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI B. SHANKARANAND) :

(a) Yes, Sir.

(b) No reliable data in this regard is available.

(c) and (d) It is not true that by 2000 AD there would be 5 million HIV-infected people in Delhi. The likely number of AIDS cases by the turn of the century cannot be forecast with certainty.
