Scheme to extract coal from river beds

772. SHRI V. RAJAN CHELLAP-PA: Will the Minister of COAL be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Coal India Limited had launched any scheme to extract coal from the river beds;
- (b) whether this scheme has been discontinued after implementing it partially;
 - (c) if so, the reasons therefor; and
- (d) by when the work is likely to be resumed?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF COAL (SHRI AJIT KUMAR PANJA); (a) to (d) The Government have sanctioned an advance action scheme for initiating preliminary activities in respect of Damodar river diversion project of Central Coalfields Ltd. for an amount of Rs. 5.59 crores. The proposed Damodar river diversion project is expected to release about 80 million tonnes of coking coal of Kargali seam which is proposed to be later exploited by opencast mining.

In Western Coalfields Ltd. Amb river diversion scheme was approved in April, 1993 for a capital outlay of Rs. 27.99 crores and work is undertaken in phases depending upon progress of land acquisition and other requirements.

Modernisation of coal mines

- (a) the number of modernisation projects taken up in different coal mines of CIL so far:
 - (b) what are those coal mines; and

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF COAL (SHRI AJIT KUMAR PANJA): (a) to (c) 20 modernisation projects (costing Rs. 20 crores and above each) were taken up in Coal India Limited for reorganisation. Out of these 20 projects, 9 are on-going and 11 have been completed. Names of these projects are as under:—

774. SHRI T. VENKATRAM RED-DY: Will the Minister of COAL be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government have recently increased coal cess in the North Eastern region of the country; and
 - (b) if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF COAL (SHRI AJIT KUMAR PANJA); (a) and (b) The Central Government does not levy any cess on coal.

According to available information Govt of Meghalaya has been collecting Minerals Cess on coal at the following rates:—

- 1. Rs. 10.00 per tonne for the period from 1.10.1989 to 31.3.1993.
- 2 Rs. 35.00 per tonne for the period from 1.4.1993 to 31.1.1994.
 - 3. Rs. 30,00 per tonne for the period w.e.f. 1.2,1994.

Govt, of Assam was levying a land tax of Rs. 100 per tonne of coal produced which has been withdrawn by them w.e.f. 1.2.1994. Consequently, royalty on coal produced in the State of Assam has been enhanced w.e.f. 25.3.1994 as follows:

Foreign collaboration to meet the demand of coal

775. SHRI V. RAJAN CHELLAP-PA: Will the Minister of COAL be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government have entered into foreign collaboration to meet the demand of coal in the country during 1993-94;
 - (b) if so, the details thereof; and
- (c) the category of coal which is not available in the country?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF COAL (SHRI AJIT KUMAR PANJA): (a) and (b) Government have been taken securing foreign assistance from Countries like U.K., France, Germany, Canada, Australia with a view to increase coal production by way of getting technical and financial assistance, procuring larger capacity machinery and equipment which are not indigeneously available. However, no

new contract was signed during 1993-94 to meet demand of coal in the country

(c) Existing supply of low ash coking coal is not adequate to meet the demand of Steel Plants. This is being supplemented by import of low ash coking coal. In the year 1993-94, 6.80 m.t. of coking coal was imported for blending with indigeneously available coking coal.
