THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF COMMUNICATIONS (SHRI SUKH RAM): (a) Total production achieved in Tele- Factories during 1992-93 was 135.21 Crores and during 1993-94 was Rs. 117.72 Crores.

- (b) The production target for 1992-94 was Rs. 150 Crores and that for 1993-94 was Rs. 165 Crores.
- (c) The main products of Telecom. Factories viz. CT Boxes, Microwave Towers Tubes, Main Distribution! Fram?-;'(MDF), DP Boxes, Local Pay Phones etc. etc cost competitive with private suppliers. The production of iteirw which have become obsolete due to technological advancement have been discontinued and new pro ducts viz.. Tubular Towers/Maste, MDFs for medium and large Exchan ges. Line Jack Units, Antennas, Con nectors etc. have been included in the production programme for 1994-95 with a view to utilise the existing infrastructure and resources. Chief General Managers have been authori sed to take up any DOTjnon DOT product for manufacture and market them at competitive cost and quality. It is considered that Telecom Factor ies can be run as viable units even the environment liberalised policy.
