(d) whether Government are contemplating amending its fiscal, policies to meet the situation?

THE MINISTER OP STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE (SHRI M. V. CHANDRASHEKHAR MURTHY): (a) Since the pesenta-tion of the Union Budget on February 28, 1994 the Reserve Bank of India has purchased US \$ 6642 million from authorised dealers upto July 22, 1994.

- (b) The US dollar being the intervention currency, sale and purchase of foreign exchange from the authorised dealers are effected in U.S.. dollars. The purchases by the RBI are determined by the surplus of US dollars in the Indian foreign exchange market.
- (c) Accretion to foreign exchange reserves results in reserve money creation. This increase in reserve money leads to money supply expansion which if excessive, contributes be inflation. However, supplyside factors like foodgtain stocks, availability of foreign exchange reserves r.c. mitigate these inflationary pres-sures. In the current year, the Cen-tt-al Government's recourses to net RBI credit has bean significantly lower which has moderated the impact of foreign exchange reserves on serve money and on money supply expansion.
- (d) Government is determined to keep the fiscal deficit within 6 per of GDP duing 1994-S5 against 73 per cent during 1993-94 and also restrict the recourse to ad hoc treabills as stipulated in the Budget for 1994-95. Fiscal policy is consunder tantlyunder review to meet the exig'ncies of thd situation.

Withdrawal of subsidy from energy sector

THE MINISTER OF POWER (SHRI N. K. P. SALVE): (a) No, Sir. The tariff for sale of electricity to the different sectors of consumers and the extent of subsidy to he provided is fixed by the SEBs with the approval of-the concerned State Governments.

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING (SHRI K. P. SINGH DEO): (a) Yes Sir.

(b) Present coverage of the State by AIR is 97 percent by population and 95 percent by area, while the coverage by Doordarshan is 69.7 per cent by population and 64.4 per cent i by area. The national average- cove-! rage is as follows;
