(b) if so, the details thereof; and

(c) by when these projects are likely to be cleared?

#### **Soil Conservation and Water Shed Projects**

1728. SHRI BHAGABAN MAJHI: Will the Minister of WATER RESOURCES, be pleased to state;

(a) whether Government are taking measures to implement soil conservation and watershed projects as a part of Government's programme to control floods;

(b) whether any such project has been implemented in Orissa;

(c) if so, the details thereof; and

(d) the details of the funds provided for those projects to the State of Orissa?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF URBAN DEVELOPMENT AND THE MINISTRY OF WATER RESOURCES (SHRI P. K. THUNGON): (a) A Centrally sponsored Scheme of integrated watershed management in the catchment of flood prone rivers in Gangetic basin is being implemented in the catchment of the Sone, the Ajay, the Punpun, the Ghaggar, Upper Yamuna, Upper Ganga; the Sahibi, the Gomti, and the Roopnarayan covering the states of Bihar, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Punjab and West Bengal. To some extent these measures help in controlling low floods, but do not help in controlling high floods.

(b) to (d) The State of Orissa is not covered under this scheme.
