all State Governments and Union Terri tory Administrations have abolished tuition fee in Government Schools upto upper primary level. Education in schools run by local bodies and private aided institutions is mostly fiee in the States/UTs. However, private unaided schools which constitute 3.7 percent of the tot;U elementary education schools in the country, do charge fee. Beyond elementary stage, the position diffets from stfte to state. Some States, UTs haye extended this facility to girls studying in SecondaryjSenior Secondary stage also.

percentage of girls 'centres has been increased from 25 per cent to 40 per cent. The revised scheme als₀ lays emphasis on strengthening training of NFE functionaries and ihe monitcrin.* system, development of good quality teaching/ learing material, enlisting community participation, promoting greater flexibility in implementation, etc.
