(d) Under the National Project on Biogas Development, a total of over 71,700 and 2,31.400 family type biogas plants have been set up in the States of Madhya Pradesh and Gujarat, respectively. Also under the Community, Institutional and Night-soil based Biogas plants Programme, 90 and 96 community, institutional and night-soil based biogas plants have been set up in the States of Madhya Pradesh and Gujarat, respectively. The Government is providing a package of incentives, including technical support. Central subsidy, turnkey job fee with free maintenance warranty, promotional cash incentives, publicity support, etc., for setting up of biogas plants in all States and Union Territories, including, all the districts of Madhya Pradesh.

Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of Ordnance Factories in the country as on 1st August, 1994;
- (b) the number of-employees working in these factories;
- (c) whether there are any plans or proposals to set up more ordnance factories;
- (d) if so, which are the places where such factories will be setup; and

(e) whether there are demands from various States for location of ordnance factories in then-States and if so, what are the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF DEFBNCE (SHRI MALLIKARJUN): (a) to (e) There are 39 ordnance factories, with about 1,68,000 employees. Though demands for setting up new factories have been received, having regard to the available capacities in the existing ordnance factories, defence public sector undertakings and the civil sector, there is no proposal at present to establish any new ordnance factory.
