

Joint Venture Training Course with United States

524. SHRI N.K. PREMACHANDRAN: Will the Minister of DEFENCE be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government are giving any access to the United States of America to India Military bases;

(b) if so, the details thereof;

(c) whether there is any joint venture training course with US at the Counter Insurgency and Jungle Warfare School (CIJWS) in Mizoram; and

(d) if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE (SHRI JASWANT SINGH): (a) No, Sir.

(b) Does not arise.

(c) and (d) There is no joint venture training course with the US in any Military training establishment in India. Indian Military training establishments, including the Counter Insurgency and Jungle Warfare School (CIJWS) , regularly accept officers on training from friendly foreign countries. Officers from the US have attended the training courses at CIJWS in 1996, 1997 and 2000.
