THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (DEPARTMENT OF WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT) (SHRIMATI BASAVARAJESWARI): (a) Details of food items served to children in Anganwadis under Integrated Child Development Service (ICDS) Scheme are given in Statement-A (see below). Further, the children in two Navodaya Vidyalayas in Delhi, are provided with bed tea, breakfast, lunch, afternoon tea / coffee / beverages with snacks and dinner and the food items mainly include rice, dal, atta, vegetable oil, sugar, suji, milk, curd & vegetables.

(b) Sources of purchase of the food items under the ICDS Scheme in Delhi are given in Statement 'A'. For purchase of food items under the ICDS Scheme, the Delhi Administration floats tender notice which are published in leading Newspapers. The quotations received in response to the tender notice are examined by the purchase committee. Thereafter, the samples of valid tenders are sent to Government Laboratory, Krishi Bhavan, for chemical analysis. On receipt of satisfactory test reports, the rates are checked and tender awarded.

As regards Navodaya Vidyalayas, bulk items such as rice, dal, atta, vegetable oil, sugar, suji etc. are mostly purchased from the District Supply Offices / Super Markets / Corporations etc., other items like milk, curd, vegetables etc. are purchased from suppliers identified after floating tenders or calling spot quotations, as per rules.

(c) Details on quantity item-wise, given to the children under the ICDS Scheme are in statement-'C' (See below). However, the children in Navodaya Vidyalayas are provided with food items at an average cost norm of

Rs. 350 per child per month.

(d) Details of items purchased along with cost and source of their purchase during the last three years, year-wise for providing supplementary nutrition under the ICDS Scheme are given in Statement-'B' (see below).

(e) During the current year, till date, 15 samples have been sent for analysis under the ICDS Scheme, and none has been found to be substandard or adulterated.

(f) The food items, under the ICDS Scheme, are purchased following a definite procedure and there is no bar on Kendriya Bhandar responding to the tender notice floated by Delhi Administration.

(g) and (h) The firm manufacturing Parle Biscuits or Kendriya Bhandar can submit tenders at the appropriate time when new tenders are invited for supply of food to the beneficiaries under the ICDS Scheme. For supply of food items for children in Navodaya Vidyalayas, the Navodaya Vidyalaya Samiti is not in a position to assure purchase of a particular brand product.

Kendriya Vidyalaya in Upper Assam

4283. **SHRI N. GIRI PRASAD:** Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) the names of locations of Kendriya Vidyalayas (KV) in Upper Assam districts, district-wise;

(b) the names of educational institutions in the said districts, districtwise having affiliation with Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE)

(c) the names of educational institutions in said districts, location-wise whose management is controlled by minority communities with details of medium of instruction in each such institution;

(d) the details of amounts of grants received by institutions as in (c) from Government during the last five years, year-wise and institution-wise;

(e) whether Government are aware of severe hardship being faced by a large number of students related to Central Government employees/staff in Dibrugarh area with transferable job throughout the country due to no Kendriya Vidyalaya at Dibrugarh; if so, whether Government propose to set up Kendriya Vidyalaya at Dibrugarh and by when; and

(f) if not, reasons therefor?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE

DEVELOPMENT (DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND CULTURE) (KUMARI SELJA): (a) to (f) Kendriya Vidyalaya are not opened on district/ statewide basis. They are opened in Civil and Defence Sectors where there is a concentration of transferable Govt. employees. The Vidyalayas are also opened in Project sectors and in the Institutions of higher learning where the sponsoring agencies agrees to meet the recurring and non-recurring expenditure for running the school and also provides the necessary infrastructural facilities. A list of schools, including KVs in Assam affiliated to CBSE is at Annex. (*see below*).

Govt. of India does not give financial aids to private schools. CBSE grants affiliation to schools irrespective of whether the institutions are managed by any particular community. The medium of instruction in all CBSE affiliated schools are Hindi/English.

KVS has intimated that there are already 6 Kendriya Vidyalayas in Dibrugarh District including one at Air Force Station of Dibrugarh which is within 10 Kilometers from the main city of Dibrugarh. A proposal was received from the Distt. Administration of Dibrugarh in 1992 for opening a K.V. but there was no commitment regarding provision of infrastructural facilities which are required as per the norms. Though matter has been taken up with the Distt. Administration, there has been no response from them yet.
