

Computerised Railway reservation facilities in the country

280. SHRI BHAGABAN MAJHI:
Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have any proposal under its consideration to introduce computerised railway reservation facility through out the country;

(b) if so, the year by which such computerised railway ticket reservation facility is expected to be provided in every station;

(c) the target date set therefor; and

(d) the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF RAILWAYS
(SHRI C. K. JAFFER SHARIEF):

(a) to (d) Extension of Computerised Passenger Reservation System (PRS) to various stations in the country is being done on the basis of reservation workload subject to availability of fund. Each year, stations are selected for computerisation on the basis of their reservation workload and/or if the station is important from some other point of view such as being a State capital. The endeavour of the Ministry of Railways is to expand the PRS network to as many stations as possible. Already more than 80 per cent of the reservation workload in the country has been brought under the coverage of PRS.

(a) No short term loan was taken during the last three years by Indian Railways. Indian Railways resort to long term borrowings from General Revenues, to finance works chargeable to Capital including Metropolitan Transport Projects. The loan
