Registered Medical Practitioners in Allopathy

1406. SHRI V. RAJESHWAR RAO : Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) the number of registered medical practitioners in Allopathy in the country with M.B.B.S. qualifications, as on 1st April, 1992;

(b) the number of registered medical practitioners engaged in actual clinical practice including those teaching in hospitals; and

(c) the number of registered medical practitioners engaged in non-clinical work?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRIMATI D. K. THARA DEVI SIDDHARTHA) : (a) As per information available with the Medical Council of India, the total number of registered medical practitioners in Allopathy in the country with the medical qualifications included in the schedules to the 3MC Act, 1956 as on 1st April, 1992 is 4.14.960.

(b) and (c) No such information is compiled by Medical Council of India.

Indenting of medicines in C.G.H.S. Unani Dispensaries

1407. MAULANA OBAIDULLAH KHAN AZMI : Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state :

(a) whether it is a fact that in the event of non-availability of any medicine in CGHS allopathic dispensaries, the same is indented from Super Bazar/Local chemists and supplied to the beneficiaries in two-three days and that in case of emergency, authority slip is given to the beneficiary to procure the medicine from Super Bazar/ Local chemist without any payment;

(b) if so, whether such arrangements exist in C.G.H.S. Unani dispensaries also;

(c) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor; and

(d) what steps are being taken in this regard ?
