वित्त मंत्रालय में राज्य मंत्री (श्री आन्तरिक मामलों के विभाग) : (क) से (घ) विदेश भेजे जाने के बारे में जारी स्वीकृतियों के आधार पर, सरकारी प्रतिनिधिमण्डल विदेशी मुद्रा या तो विदेशों में भारतीय दूतावासों से अथवा भारत में प्राधिकृत बैंकों से ले सकते हैं। गैर-सरकारी प्रतिनिधि मण्डलों के सदस्यों को भारत सरकार द्वारा विदेशी मुद्रा स्वीकृत नहीं की जाती है। वे अपनी हकदारी तथा भारतीय रिजर्व बैंक द्वारा निर्धारित प्रक्रिया के अनुसार प्राधिकृत भारतीय बैंकों से विदेशी मुद्रा लेते हैं। सरकारी तथा गैर-सरकारी प्रतिनिधि मण्डलों को स्वीकृत विदेशी मुद्रा के आंकड़े केन्द्रीय तौर पर नहीं रखे जाते हैं।

Payment of Pension from Banks in Rajkot

SINGH) : (a) to (d) As per the information furnished by the nationalised banks, there is no pension case pending and due for payment in the branches at Rajkot. Reserve Bank of India (RBI) have reported that they have not received any complaint against the branches of nationalised banks in Rajkot regarding payment of pension. However, certain complaints have been received by RBI regarding delayed payment of pension

in other areas. The complaints have been taken up by RBI with concerned banks for redressal of the grievances.

Direction to States regarding Foreign Tours by Ministers

RAMESHWAR THAKUR) : (a) As per Government of India guidelines circulated to all State Govt., proposals for foreign visits of the Ministers from States are required to be submitted to the Department of Economic Affairs who process the case and refer the proposal to the Prime Minister's office for obtaining the clearance of Prime Minister.

(b) During the Calendar year 1991, two Chief Ministers and 9 Ministers of States went on visits abroad. The break up of details is as follows :—

1. Assam 2 (Minister for Labour and Minister for Industries).
2. Haryana : 1 (Minister for Animal Husbandry).
3. Karnataka : 1 (Minister for Agriculture).
4. Maharashtra : 1 (Chief Minister).
5. Manipur : 1 (Minister for Arts and Culture).
6. Uttar Pradesh : 2 (Minister for Sugar Industries & Minister of Health and F.W.).
7. West Bengal : 3 (Chief Minister (Twice), Minister for Mass Education Extension, and Minister of Finance.
