

## THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF SURFACE TRANSPORT

(SHRI JAGDISH TYTLER) : (a) and (b) The Government of Rajasthan forwarded a list of 5 proposals for declaration as new National Highways in the 8th Plan including the roads in a question as detailed in list enclosed as Statement [see below]. However, due to constraint of financial resources for national Highways made available in the 8th Plan, it is difficult at this stage to declare any new National Highways in any State including Rajasthan. The matter will be re-examined at the time of mid-term in view of the 8th Plan in case financial allocations for National Highways are increased.

(c) There is no proposal for seeking foreign assistance for construction of new National Highways as yet.

### Tiger Population in the Country

(a) what is the tiger population in the country at present;

(b) whether there has been an alarming rise in tiger poaching in the country; and

(c) if so, the details thereof and the steps taken to curb poaching ?

## THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF ENVIRONMENT AND FORESTS (SHRI KAMAL NATH) :

(a) As per 1989 census, the estimated tiger population in the country is 4334.

(b) and (c) No reports of any alarming rise in tiger poaching cases have been received from State wildlife authorities. However, in the case of Ranthambhore, the Kumar enquiry report mentioned some evidence of poaching, the extent of which is not yet known. The state governments have been advised to strengthen vigilance and intensify patrolling around the Tiger Reserves.
