

**Updating Indian Airlines/Air India**

53. SHRI KRISHNA KUMAR BIRLA: Will the Minister of CIVIL AVIATION AND TOURISM be pleased to state \*

(a) whether the attention of Government has been drawn to a news item captioned "Need to update airlines" which appeared in the Hindustan Times of the 29th September, 1992;

(b) if so, whether several foreign-airlines are earning huge profits as compared to the Indian Airlines/Air India;

(c) whether the aged fleet and non-observance of punctuality are the major setbacks for airlines in India; and

(d) if so, what remedial measures Government propose to take in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF CIVIL AVIATION AND TOURISM (SHRI MADHAVRAO SCINDIA): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) According to published data of IATA, the world's scheduled airlines have suffered an estimated operating loss of US \$ 1000 million during the year 1991. Most airlines, including US mega carriers and reputed European carriers have been in the red in this period. While Air India earned a net profit of Rs. 145.89 crores, Indian Airlines suffered a loss of Rs. 198.85 crores during the year 1991-92

(c) and (d) The average age of Indian Airlines fleet is 9.5 years and that of Air India is 9.8 years. Air India is acquiring four B 747-400 aircraft to replace the old aircraft. Indian Airlines is also adding 12 more A-320 aircraft to its fleet. Other measures like monitoring of punctuality, improvement of customer service etc, are also taken to improve the operating performance.

**Vayudoot service to Gujarat**

(c) if so, what steps Government are taking to promote air services in Gujarat?

(d) if not, what are the reasons therefor?
