(d) Six additional categories of workers viz., supervisors (all professions), skilled workers (all professions); light/Medium/heavy vehicle drivers, clerical workers of all categories including stenographers, storekeepers, timekeepers, typists etc., and cooks excluding those domestic employment have been placed in ECNR (Emigration Clearance Not Required) category w.e.f.

4 October, 91. This concession is presently valid upto 3 April, 1993. With this enlargement of ECNR categories, the regulatory role of the Protectors of Emigrants has been considerably reduced.

Status of Tea Workers

Will the Minister of LABOUR be pleased to state :

(a) whether it is a fact that Tea Workers are the lowest paid in the organised sector;

(b) whether any study has been conducted in this regard; and

(c) if so, the details thereof ?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR (SHRI PABAN SINGH GHATOWAR) : (a) No, Sir. The average daily earnings of workers in coffee plantations (Rs. 11.58) and Mines (Rs. 15.68) are lower than those of workers in Tea Plantations (Rs. 15.86).

(b) and (c) Yes, Sir. The 4th Round of Occupational Wage Survey was conducted during 1985-90 in 53 industries comprising 3 plantations, 5 mines and 45 manufacturing industries. Average daily earnings of workers in the plantation sector ranged from Rs. 11.58 in coffee to Rs. 21.00 in Rubber, in the mining sector from Rs. 15.68 in Mica to Rs. 67.38 in Coal and in the manufacturing sector from Rs. 24.09 in Tea processing factories to Rs. 88.71 in manufacture of Electrical Industrial Machinery, Appliances and Parts.
